Three Parts of Christian Youth in Action Training:

- **Pre-Training** – You must participate in the pre-training in your chapter area in May and early June. We will also have some reading for you to complete before going on to the next part of training.
- **Preparing Together** – All WTX students and leaders will meet in Levelland at South Plains College June 17-22. There will be classes, discussion groups, practicums, and fun activities.
- **Practice Club Week** – Students will teach “practice” 5-Day Clubs in your chapter area June 24-28 and will be evaluated.

After completing all three parts of the training, students are asked to teach 5-Day Clubs in July. Please discuss this with your local director. We want you to use what you learned and reach more children who need to hear about Jesus.

Two Ways You Can Serve this Summer

After you complete CYIA, you will be a summer missionary. If you are 14 or older, you can serve as a temporary employee or as a volunteer.

1. Temporary Employee:
 - a. You need to be at least 14 years old.
 - b. You will be paid, and your hourly rate will be determined by your chapter’s local committee.
 - c. You will be expected to teach up to three 5-Day Clubs a day.

- d. You will need to sign a financial agreement with your chapter.
 - e. You will need to help with fundraising by mailing letters to friends and family.
 - f. Your CYIA application needs to be received by April 1, 2024.
2. Volunteer: If you serve as a volunteer, you will not be paid. Your service so that children can hear the gospel message will be a blessing! You will not be required to teach three clubs a day.

Statement of Faith of Child Evangelism Fellowship® *WE BELIEVE* -

That “All Scripture is given by inspiration of God,” by which we understand the whole book called THE BIBLE; that it is inerrant in the original writing and that its teaching and authority are absolute, supreme and final. That the Holy Spirit guided the holy men of old in all that they wrote. 2 Timothy 3:16; Deuteronomy 4:2; 2 Peter 1:21

The Godhead eternally exists in three persons, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. These three are one God, having the same nature, attributes and perfection. Romans 1:20; Matthew 28:19; Deuteronomy 4:35; John 17:5

In the personality and Deity of the Lord Jesus Christ, begotten of the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, truly God and truly man. John 1:1, 14; 10:30; Matthew 1:20; Luke 1:30, 31; Philippians 2:5-7; 1 Timothy 3:16; Colossians 1:19

At the time of acceptance of Christ as Savior, He comes to dwell within the believer and to live out His life of holiness and power through him. That the Church is composed of all those who truly believe on the Lord Jesus Christ as Savior. It is the body and bride of Christ. That every believer, whether Jew or Gentile, is baptized into the body of Christ by the Holy Spirit, and having thus become members of one another we are responsible to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace, rising above all sectarian prejudices and denominational bigotry and loving one another with a pure heart fervently. Doctrinal Protection Policy - Adopted by CEF International Board of Trustees, May 6, 2002

Child Evangelism Fellowship® continues in its commitment to its Statement of Faith, which embodies the non-negotiable and historic beliefs of evangelical Christians.

Within the community of evangelical believers various distinctives exist which do not prevent our fellowship in the Lord and our effectiveness as child evangelists.

We therefore resolve that CEF® workers are qualified by their unreserved commitment to CEF's Statement of Faith and their further commitment in all CEF activities to refrain from teaching or otherwise advocating doctrinal distinctives either contrary to or in addition to the Statement of Faith.

Recognizing the spiritual need of boys and girls in our community and around the world, I would like to assist in the work of *Child Evangelism Fellowship (CEF)*.

I understand that CEF is without specific denominational affiliation and have read the Statement of Faith and CEF Doctrinal Protection Policy. In becoming a coworker with CEF, and in order to protect the ministry, I agree not to propagate or practice in CEF ministries any distinctive or controversial doctrines, methods and practices that would go beyond the CEF Statement of Faith and the approved CEF curriculum. These would include but not be limited to such things as modes of baptism, speaking in tongues, interpretation of Scripture by experience, healing on demand, etc. I understand that anyone who does not adhere to this agreement cannot serve with CEF as paid staff or volunteer.

In teaching Bible lessons in core CEF programs I will use exclusively materials approved by CEF. In offering my services I trust the Lord to make me a faithful servant, and should problems arise between CEF and me that cannot be fully reconciled, I will quietly withdraw to preserve the harmony essential to having an effective Christian witness.

Standards of Conduct & Dress Code for Students & Leaders

As brothers and sisters in Christ serving God together, we are responsible in our relationships with:

- Teammates
- Children whom we teach
- CYIA staff and leaders
- CEF as an organization and your church
- Local volunteers who help
- God (*your most important relationship*)

Our appearance, dress, conversation, and actions will either help or hinder the cause of Christ and the message we want to bring. At all times, conduct should be such that would bring honor and glory to the Lord Jesus Christ. Bringing reproach to the name of Christ or failure to adhere to the CYIA dress code and standards of conduct may result in being sent home from CYIA.

Attendance: You are expected to attend all sessions unless granted permission by your local CEF leader to miss.

Name Tags: Wear your name tag to all sessions and meals; wear it when teaching a 5-Day Club during CYIA.

Keeping CYIA Location Clean: All paper should be put into proper containers, not thrown on the ground. We need to respect South Plains College campus where we meet and keep it clean. We will need your help to keep all rooms where you meet clean (wiping down tables, picking up trash, etc.). After you eat a meal or have a snack, we expect you to throw away any trash; leave the table clean.

Personal Cleanliness: Please wash your hands before snacks and meals and throughout the day. Hand sanitizer will be available. Be sure to shower each day and use deodorant.

Recreation: There may be organized games, but you can also use this time for free time. The game room in the Student Center will be available to us.

Cell Phones: You may keep your cell phone with you, but please do not allow it to be a distraction during class time, working with your team, study times, mealtimes, or during practicums. If your cell phone does become a distraction, you will be asked to either leave it in your room or put it away.

Student Relationships: Friendships with Christians of the opposite gender are beneficial in social, spiritual, and leadership development. You may talk, walk, sit, and dine with them at appropriate times. However, because the goals of CYIA would be violated by the distraction of any romantic relationships, existing relationships of unmarried couples are to be put “on hold” during CYIA. Also, the pursuit of such relationships is to be set aside during CYIA training so that Christ alone will be exalted.

Study Times: This time is to be spent preparing for practicums or preparing to teach the children in your club. Let your team leader know if you prefer quiet study on your own or working with others to prepare. But be sure that your method of study does not distract those around you.

Dress Code:

***Please read this carefully since it is modified each year
and ask your parents to read it, too.**

For morning & evening worship, class time, and teaching clubs wear clothing that is neat, clean and in reasonably good condition. We ask that students **not** wear:

- ❖ Clothing that is too tight (form fitting) or that exposes midriffs, backs, undergarments, revealing necklines, etc. If you only have pants that are tight, wear a long t-shirt.
- ❖ Clothing with writing, slogans, pictures, or symbols that do not honor God.
- ❖ Tank tops or crop tops.
- ❖ Shorts. (*If we have a fun night at Adventure Park – or another location - again this year, you can wear shorts; but no short-shorts or skin-tight shorts.*)
- ❖ Ripped jeans.
