Thank you for applying to our summer training program for Christian teens! *Christian Youth in Action** (CYIA) can help you grow in your relationship with God and will prepare you to serve Him. As a student, you will learn how to:

- Present the Gospel of Jesus Christ to children
- Organize and teach a Bible club for children
- Work with a team as you serve God

CYIA is for teens 13-19 who have been believers in Christ for at least one year and who desire to serve God. Please read through this application carefully and share it with your parents.

All students need to read CEF's Statement of Faith and sign our Ministry Compliance Agreement. **New students** are required to complete a separate screening form that we will provide.

After you have completed this application, please submit it to either your chapter office or to the state office. You can: 1) Scan it and email it to cgateacefwt@gmail.com; 2) Send it by regular mail (USPS); or 3) Hand-deliver it to either office. There is also an online version of the application at www.cefwesttexas.com/cyia. When you apply, a \$30 application fee must be paid.

April 25th (if you want to volunteer as a summer missionary)

Three Parts of Christian Youth in Action Training:

- **Pre-Training** You must participate in the pre-training in your chapter area in May and early June. We will also have some reading for you to complete before the next part of the training.
- <u>Preparing Together</u> All WTX students and leaders will meet in Levelland at South Plains College June 15-20. There will be classes, discussion groups, practicums, and fun activities.
- <u>Practice Clubs</u> Students will teach "practice" 5-Day Clubs in your chapter area (or another chapter) June 22-26 and will be evaluated. **Then the students will continue to teach 5-Day Clubs throughout the summer**. So, the training continues after you return home.

Please note: After completing all three parts of the training, students will be asked to teach 5-Day Clubs throughout the summer. Please discuss this with your local director. We want you to use what you learned and reach more children who need to hear about Jesus.

Two Ways You Can Serve this Summer

After you complete CYIA, you will be a **summer missionary**. If you are 16 or older, you can serve as a <u>temporary employee</u> or as a <u>volunteer</u>.

- 1. Temporary Employee:
 - a. You need to be at least 16 years old.

- b. You will be paid, and your hourly rate will be determined by your chapter's local committee; you will complete a timesheet.
- c. You will be expected to teach up to three 5-Day Clubs a day.
- d. You will need to sign a financial agreement with your chapter.
- e. You will need to help with fundraising by mailing letters to friends and family.
- f. Your CYIA application needs to be received by April 1, 2025.
- g. You are expected to provide transportation to clubs or the local CEF office.
- 2. <u>Volunteer</u>: If you serve as a volunteer, you will not be paid. Your service so that children can hear the gospel message will be a blessing! You will not be required to teach three clubs a day.

Within the community of evangelical believers various distinctives exist which do not prevent our fellowship in the Lord and our effectiveness as child evangelists.

We therefore resolve that CEF® workers are qualified by their unreserved commitment to CEF's Statement of Faith and their further commitment in all CEF activities to refrain from teaching or otherwise advocating doctrinal distinctives either contrary to or in addition to the Statement of Faith.

Recognizing the spiritual need of boys and girls in our community and around the world, I would like to assist in the work of Child Evangelism Fellowship (CEF).

I understand that CEF is without specific denominational affiliation and have read the Statement of Faith and CEF Doctrinal Protection Policy. In becoming a co-worker with CEF, and to protect the ministry, I agree not to propagate or practice in CEF ministries any distinctive or controversial doctrines, methods, and practices that would go beyond the CEF Statement of Faith and the approved CEF curriculum. These would include but not be limited to such things as modes of baptism, speaking in tongues, interpretation of Scripture by experience, healing on demand, etc. I understand that anyone who does not adhere to this agreement cannot serve with CEF as paid staff or volunteer.

In teaching Bible lessons in core CEF programs I will use exclusively materials approved by CEF.

In offering my services I trust the Lord to make me a faithful servant, and should problems arise between CEF and me that cannot be fully reconciled, I will quietly withdraw to preserve the harmony essential to having an effective Christian witness.

Christian Youth in Action™ 2026 Standards of Conduct & Dress Code for Students & Leaders

As brothers and sisters in Christ serving God together, we are responsible in our relationships with:

- Teammates
- CYIA staff and leaders
- Local volunteers who help
- Children whom we teach
- your church
- CEF as an organization
- God your most important relationship

Our appearance, dress, conversation, and actions will either help or hinder the cause of Christ and the message we want to bring. At all times, conduct should be such that would bring honor and glory to the Lord Jesus Christ. Bringing reproach to the name of Christ or failure to adhere to the CYIA dress code and standards of conduct may result in being sent home from CYIA.

Attendance: You are expected to attend all sessions unless granted permission by your local CEF leader to miss.

Name Tags: Wear your name tag to all sessions and meals; wear it when teaching a 5-Day Club during CYIA.

Keeping CYIA Location Clean: All paper should be put into proper containers, not thrown on the ground. We need to respect South Plains College campus and keep it clean. We will need your help to keep all rooms where you meet clean (wiping down tables, picking up trash, etc.). After you eat a meal or have a snack, we expect you to throw away any trash; leave the table clean.

<u>Personal Cleanliness:</u> Please wash your hands before snacks and meals and throughout the day. Hand sanitizer will be available. Be sure to shower each day and use deodorant.

Recreation: There may be organized games, but you can also use this time for free time. The game room in the Student Center will be available to us.

<u>Cell Phones:</u> You may keep your cell phone with you, but please do not allow it to be a distraction during class time, working with your team, study times, mealtimes, or during practicums. If your cell phone does become a distraction, you will be asked to either leave it in your room or put it away.

<u>Student Relationships:</u> Friendships with Christians of the opposite gender are beneficial in social, spiritual, and leadership development. You may talk, walk, sit, and dine with them at appropriate times. However, because the goals of CYIA would be violated by the distraction of any romantic relationships, existing relationships of unmarried couples are to be put "on hold" during CYIA.

Also, the pursuit of such relationships is to be set aside during CYIA training so that Christ alone will be exalted.

<u>Study Times</u>: This time is to be spent preparing for practicums or preparing to teach the children in your club. Let your team leader know if you prefer to quietly study on your own or work with others to prepare. But be sure that your method of study does not distract those around you.

CYIA Dress Code

(Please read this carefully since it is modified each year. Ask your parents to read it.)

For morning worship, class time, and teaching clubs, you should wear clothing that is neat, clean and in reasonably good condition. Jeans, capri pants, skirts (girls) are all great choices.

New for 2026 - Both guys and girls **may wear long shorts** (Bermuda style) to class at South Plains College. Shorts should not be shorter than 2 inches above the knee. Anyone wearing shorts which are shorter than the acceptable length to class will be asked to change. No bicycle type shorts are allowed.

Your local director will set the guidelines for what you wear to teach 5 Day Clubs when you return home to your chapter.

We ask that students (both guys & girls) **NOT** wear the following at any time:

- Clothing that is too tight (form fitting) or that exposes midriffs, backs, undergarments, revealing necklines, etc. If you only have pants that are tight, **wear a long t-shirt.**
- Clothing with writing, slogans, pictures, or symbols that do not honor God.
- Tank tops or crop tops.
- Ripped jeans
- Short shorts
